Caring for our communities

Local organizations who have received grants from The Equity Group Foundation in the last few months include::

- Dougy Center - \$5,000 to assist them in opening a new location in Hillsboro to better serve Washington County children dealing with the grief of loss.
- Forward Stride - \$5,000 to expand their equine therapy programs to help kids transcend the psychological and physical impacts of their own medical issues.
- Girls, inc. - \$3,000 to help them set up an additional temporary house that can support 20 girls. Their mission is to assist girls in need in order to provide them the love and support they need to become confident, successful adults.
- Children's Charity Ball- \$2,500 to sponsor part of the costs of the ball. This enables the funds raised at the event to go directly to the charities. The ball benefits the Christie School, Waverly House, and Parry Center for Children.
- Hearing & Speech Institute - \$4,000 to assist in providing the Institute's professional services to families who cannot otherwise afford it. They offer assistance and support to a wide range of people with hearing and speech related needs, focusing particularly on children with autism.
- Growing Gardens - \$5,000 to support its programs promoting food gardening for improved nutrition, health, and self-reliance for low-income households.
- Innovative Services NW - \$4,600 grant for the purchase of chairs for the new Adult Day Care Center located in Vancouver.
- Mountain Star Family Relief Nursery - \$2,500 to help outfit and operate a donated mini-van so that it can transport infants to and from its child abuse and neglect prevention program in Central Oregon,
- The Hillsboro Family Resource Center - \$2,000 to help provide emergency food, clothing and basic supplies to needy families in Washington County.
- Northwest Children's Outreach - \$2,000 to help supply children with emergency clothing and other necessities. The organization currently serves an average of 125 needy children per week.
